NAIDOC WEEK

Next week is NAIDOC week and celebrations are held around Australia each July to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. This year's theme is Our Languages Matters which aims to emphasise and celebrate the unique and essential role that Indigenous languages play in cultural identity, linking people to their land and water and in the transmission of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander history, spirituality and rites, through story and song.



Year 1 News

Thank you for sending along the shoeboxes with your child. The students have thoroughly enjoyed constructing their animal habitat dioramas. They have painted their boxes and glued natural items to create their habitats. The discussions occurring in their classrooms as they worked on their art indicated their understandings of the Australian animal unit.

This week the Grade 1 students have continued to work on subtraction problems. They have learnt to model subtraction problems, solve subtraction equations and to create their own subtraction problems to share with their peers. In the area of measurement, we have been working on length, using both informal and formal units of measurement. It would be beneficial for the students to identify any forms of measurement used within the home to reinforce the practical applications of units of measurement. Further to this, the students will be looking at data and predicting the chance of events occurring as part of the Chance and Data unit.

In literacy sessions, students have been writing information reports on their chosen animal of study. In addition, they have written acrostic and 'what am I?' poems about Australian animals.

The students will bring home extra readers for the upcoming holidays. A good chance to practise the strategies of reading learnt throughout the term. We wish all our families a safe and enjoyable family holiday!



Developing independence when it feels positively risky



Most parents we meet love the notion of promoting self-sufficiency in their children. However there are a number of barriers to overcome when it comes to putting the concept into practice.

Time is a common barrier. Let's face it, when time is at a premium it can be simpler to make their lunch/get them out of bed/sort out their friendship problem than leaving these things for them to do. Somehow we need to strike a balance between doing things for them and allowing them the time and space to do things for themselves.



Dear Parent/Guardian,

As part of our commitment to keep you informed about your child's education, we are writing to update you about some changes to your child's reports.

Since Term 1 2017, Victorian government and Catholic schools have been teaching against the new Victorian Curriculum, for Prep to Year 10. This is a change from the previous AusVELS curriculum. The Victorian Curriculum is organised in 11 levels (Foundation to Level 10), and each level demonstrates progression from the previous level's skills and knowledge.

Students progress along the levels individually, determined by need. The Levels of the curriculum no longer necessarily reflect the school year level of the student.

Student Reports are provided each semester to inform students, parents and teachers about the individual curriculum progress of each student. Reports are individual, and recognise both that learning does not progress at the same rate for each child, and that children learn at different rates in each subject and stage of learning.

A teacher's judgement about the student's placement on the Victorian Curriculum continuum is based on a range of evidence from both formal and informal assessment tasks, classroom observations, and other learning experiences. Teachers will determine where a student sits on the continuum for each Learning Area.

The new Victorian Curriculum is not comparable with AusVELS, so some reports will not provide indication of your child's progress from previous years.

In English and Maths, the reports will show a comparison of results with the AusVELS level 12 months ago. However, because of the changes in curriculum and assessment of students, it may not always appear that a student has made progress.

Please be aware **this does not mean** your child has made no progress this year, or that there has not been meaningful teaching and learning taking place.

Rather, it reflects a change in the way we assess progress, and will give students, parents and teachers a more accurate picture of where a student is placed from Prep to 10, in order for us to tailor their learning to suit their needs, and to best prepare them for the senior years of school.

Reports will be available for parents and students to access via Compass on **Friday, 30th June**. If you need help accessing reports, please contact the school office.
