Canteen Food




The issue of obesity in Australian children has increased. Australia now has one of the highest rates of childhood obesity in the world. Our school, Kyabram P-12 College, is one of the many schools that provide a variety of foods in our canteen, some being nutritious and some being 'sometimes' foods.

This semester a class of 19 students have undertaken a Year 10 subject called Health and Nutrition. This class aims to increase student knowledge of Australia's health, mental health, and nutrition. The students were asked to analyse the school canteen's secondary menu, and then come up with a way to encourage other students to choose healthier foods. We decided to survey 20 Year 10 students at our College about which foods from our school canteen they would prefer, some being nutritious and some being 'sometimes' foods.

The surveys show that the healthier option was the least preferred, and the vegetarian pastie was the only item that no students liked. The data also shows that the Year 10 girls would prefer more of the nutritious foods than the boys. Although, there are concerns that the data was not completely accurate as some students didn't acknowledge the fact that the school canteen was the food provider.

This article provides the opportunity for parents to talk to their children about the food choices they are making. Please ensure that your children know the difference between nutritious foods and 'sometimes' foods, and the outcome of eating these foods. Overall this knowledge will hopefully decrease the issue of childhood obesity in Australia.
