THE 2018 ATTITUDES TO SCHOOLS SURVEY

We want our students to tell us what they think

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school. The Attitudes to School survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training. The survey assists schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience at school.

Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience. This year the Attitudes to School survey will be conducted at our school between Monday 23rd April to Friday 1st June. The survey only takes 20-30 minutes to complete and occurs during your child's class time.

Students from Year 4 to Year 12, at our school will participate in the survey. Your child will complete the survey online during school hours using a purpose built secure online survey tool.

The survey results will be reported back to the school in Term 3. The survey results will be communicated to parents through annual reporting.

The Department has updated the survey last year to include important new measures that are known to influence student engagement and performance.

Students privacy is our priority

Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used by the Department to combine data for research purposes only. Your child's privacy and the confidentiality of your child's survey responses will be protected at all times. No identifiable personal data is included in the survey response file. This survey is not a test and your child has the right to refuse or withdraw from the survey at any point before, during, or after completion.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN is an annual assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It tests the types of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. The tests cover skills in reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation, and numeracy. The assessments will be undertaken between $15^{th} - 17^{th}$ May. Students have been supported in preparing for these assessment tasks to ensure they do their very best. We have a number of staff that have been working with the students in relevant year levels over recent weeks. If you would like further information please go to www.naplan.edu.au

UNIFORM

I would like to thank parents and families for their support in ensuring that their child is wearing the correct college uniform. Tori will now be competing in the National Championships in September this year.


