Tatura SMART FARM Visit

On the 22nd of February 20 students and 3 staff from Kyabram P-12 College and East Loddon P-12 College visited the Tatura Smart Farm to participate in an educational information session regarding Agricultural and Horticultural technology. Students were welcomed to the facility with a vast number key examples of technology that was both innovative and practical. Students were amazed that such a facility was playing such a part of their agricultural and horticultural futures and for some the visit really helped to clarify a future pathway.

Students were given a tour of the sundial farm, shown key monitoring sites and spoken to about the range of benefits from gathering data. Staff and students were invited to ask questions about the use of data from such areas as soil moisture, sunlight hours, temperature, wind speed and direction and how these variables influence fruit growing conditions and production. This was a great lead in experience for students to then be able to go on and participate in making and using a soil moisture metre in the laboratory section of the trip.





The varieties of fruit that is grown at the Tatura facility is truly staggering. The detailed explanations that were delivered to students about international markets and selection specifications was terrific. An eye opener for many. Over 160 different varieties of pears, both staff and students were taken aback by this. It was pleasing to see that students were able to ask questions and have them answered by experts in their field, such a beneficial experience, one students' across the country have greatly missed over the last 2 years. Staff and students from Kyabram P-12 College and East-Loddon P-12 College are greatly appreciative to the dedicated staff that shared their knowledge and facilitated a meaningful educational experience.
