Dear Parents and Friends,

Kyabram P-12 College are excited to be upgrading and modernising several areas across the school with two Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA) projects with the predicted date of completion and handover is September 2023.

The new Ky P-12 Central area will boast a new Wellbeing Hub. This space will see students able to access Wellbeing Staff, Chaplains, Youth Worker, Mental Health Practitioners, Koorie Education Support Officers, and will be accessible to all students. This area will also provide space for visiting Occupational Therapists and other services. The Wellbeing Hub includes a central break out area, rooms for one on one meetings, with privacy and access to the outdoor courtyard and gardens.

Ky P-12 Central will also host a new administration area which will provide a centralised office for students, parents and staff across P-12. This area will see our Administration Staff and Principals working together to achieve the vision of the new college since the inception of the merger.

Also included in the upgrade will be a new library with both traditional books as well as ebooks, other electronic resources, an internet access area and a space for our staff across the college and our community to collaborate.

The College Council are also happy to be including a new canteen for students with separate areas and undercover eating spaces for our Primary and Secondary sections of the college.

The current Senior Building will be refurbished to improve acoustic quality and provide more break out spaces for both staff and students.

The Lone Pine tree at the college will also see a move and the College Council have been working closely with our local Legacy Group and specialised tree removalists to find a suitable place for this important tree. Lone Pine will move forward on the Fischer Street zone, to continue to take pride of place at the front of the College entrance.

Attitudes to School Survey

The Attitudes to School Survey was offered to our students from Year 4 to Year 12 to complete online from 2nd May to 10th June 2022.

As part of our strategic planning, our staff utilise student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction. We will review our student survey results to find out what your child thinks of our school and gain an understanding of students perceptions and experience of our college. Our school will utilise the survey results to plan programs and activities to further enhance your child's education, engagement and wellbeing at our college.

Semester 1 reports will be available for students, parents and carers at the end of next week. Both student achievement and progress is included in the report.

This includes a teacher judgement against the achievement standards, assigned as a score, that accurately reflects where each student is along the relevant learning continuum for all curriculum areas taught during the reporting period.
