

Payment of Service Fees

Rationale:

College Council has a responsibility to manage the finances of the OSHC service, and in doing so, must ensure that a fair and reasonable process for managing outstanding debts is developed and implemented.

To provide a quality program and service to families using OSHC which is self-funded.

Aims:

To minimise outstanding debts, and to provide a process for managing outstanding debts should they occur.

To maintain the OSHC Program with ease of payments for parents and management at the school level.

Implementation:

- College Council will provide opportunities for all parents experiencing financial difficulties to enter into alternative and confidential payment arrangements with the service.
- College Council will allocate funds annually to be used at the discretion of the OSHC Committee to assist families experiencing financial hardship.
- The OSHC committee College Council will be responsible for managing all outstanding debts.
- Outstanding debts will result in a reminder communication.
- Outstanding debts in excess of 14 days will result in a telephone call from the OSHC approved provider.
- Parents with outstanding debts in excess of 30 days, (are unable to attend until payment is made, usually 4 weeks). Parents will be contacted to further discuss any financial hardship.
- Outstanding debts will carry over from one year to another.
- Students will not be denied access to the program,-for which they have paid, simply because payment has not been received for other school charges or voluntary contributions.

Payment of Fees:

- Payment for After School Care accounts is via the Xplor website. Families are given log in details for Xplor and are required to add their banking details.
- Payments will be processed weekly on a Thursday up to and including care for the Friday before. Failure to be up to date with payments may result in exclusion from the program.
- Families are able to claim Child Care Subsidy (CCS) to assist with the cost of child care.
- The percentage of subsidy families are able to claim is means tested.
